PASTOR'S PEN

Not Your Grandmother's Kirkwood

At Saturday's Bloomington Chamber Singers' performance of Haydn's *Creation*, I had the privilege of offering words of welcome. So, on your behalf, I invited the audience to "take in" our beautiful sanctuary, including the Tree of Life window, as they listened to the powerful and uplifting music and words that truly gave glory to God.

The concert was wonderful! Afterwards, several things happened: First, a gentleman from the audience (who had never been in our church) approached me and shared his interpretation of the window. As he enthusiastically pointed out symbols (some of which I had never noticed!) it was obvious that he had allowed the window to draw him into the larger story of God's ongoing creative work in this world.

Second, several people came up to me holding a customized flier that included invitational information about who we are as a community of faith. "Thank you, for your words of welcome," they said as they tucked the flier into their purses and pockets.

Third, members of the Bloomington Chamber Singers expressed deep gratitude for the use of our space, not only for our flexibility in allowing them to adapt the chancel area to fit the choir and orchestra, but especially for the magnificent way that sound resonates in our sanctuary. During the clean-up that followed the concert, one of the musicians raved about how our sanctuary offered the "best" acoustics in town.

Fourth, as people spilled out of the sanctuary, Kirkwood Avenue was offering its "best" acoustic-- in the form of post-Little 500

revelry! And simultaneously, the alley behind us offered another acoustic as a loud and guttural voice of one of our homeless neighbors echoed off of the alley walls. What a juxtaposition of sounds and people and life experiences! This is no longer your grandmother's Kirkwood Avenue!

While much about this corner has changed over the years, I give thanks to God for calling us to remain where we were planted 191 years ago, naming ourselves the Kirkwood Avenue Christian Church. Since that time, although our name and building have changed, our faithful witness to God's presence has remained steadfast. My prayer is that those who become acquainted with us —whether through attending a concert, or walking past our front doors, or eating breakfast in our Great Hall, or attending a 12-step meeting, or worshiping on Sunday morning, or participating in one of our many small groups—will also come to know and experience Christ's inclusive embrace through us.

As we give thanks for this congregation's long and faithful ministry on Kirkwood Avenue, may our hearts and minds resonate with the acoustics of God's amazing grace, Christ's redeeming love, and the Spirit's mighty power. And may the physical space that we call our "church home" continue to serve as a beacon of divine beauty, strength, hope, and welcome for all God's people.

Children & Youth Assemble Hygiene Kits for Church World Service

Fifteen children and youth worked together in the Chapel Gathering Space this past Sunday, April 23, to assemble 50 hygiene kits for Church World Service. Each kit was stuffed with items donated during Lent—soap, washcloth, hand towel, nail clipper, comb, bandages, toothbrush—sealed up neatly in a plastic, gallon-sized storage bag. Once all the kits were prepared, we blessed them, thanking God for the large and small hands that prepared them, and asking for safety, health and hope for those who receive them.


The kits will be delivered to a newly announced drop-off location in Indianapolis in early June. Once Church World Service receives the kits, they will be warehoused with other donated kits until the next natural disaster, war, or unexpected event displaces people from their homes. Whether that event occurs in Indiana or India, Church World Service will be there, and our small efforts will help keep folks clean and healthy in the immediate aftermath.
