Opportunities for Spiritual Growth during the Lenten Season

As we enter the season of Lent, take time to explore opportunities for spiritual growth, reflection, worship and fellowship at FCC.

We begin the Lenten Season by welcoming a guest preacher, Jeanette Salley of Global Ministries. Jeanette will offer the message during Sunday worship at 10:00 am on March 10 as well as give two forum presentations (9:00 am and 11:15 am) on her work as a Mission Co-Worker for Global Ministries in Nicaragua. We hope you will join us on Sunday for this special opportunity to hear about the important work of Global Ministries.

Also this Sunday, two Lenten group study opportunities will begin. Rev. Chuck Jones will lead a new group (for young adults in their 20s and 30s) that will explore *"What is Lent?" and Other Questions You've Wanted to Ask*. Many of us grew up in faith traditions other than the Disciples of Christ, which means we sometimes experience new and unfamiliar things at FCC. Bring your questions and explore them in light of your unique faith experience. This group will meet on Sundays at 11:15 a.m. on the 3rd floor.

FCC and our neighbors at First Presbyterian Church have partnered for a 5-week

exploration of Celtic Spirituality. The group will travel through Lent in the spiritual landscape of the Irish imagination. Join us as we journey together exploring the sacredness of the intersections of our daily and spiritual lives. We will be reading John Philip Newell's book *The Rebirthing of God: Christianity's Struggle for New Beginnings* and poems by Mary Oliver. The group will meet on Sundays (March 10-April 7) at First Presbyterian Church. Arrive at 6:00 pm for a simple meal followed by discussion at 6:30 p.m. Be sure to read Pastor Helen's article on page 2 of this newsletter if you are interested in joining this group.

Pastor's Pen

Thin Place. Celtic Christians have used this term for millennia to describe actual places where the boundary between heaven and earth is razor thin and practically permeable—mystical places where one can sense an undeniable connection to the Divine. The windswept Island of Iona, where St. Columba of Ireland brought Christianity to the shores of Scotland, has long been considered to be one of those thin places. As a matter of fact, I had a rare “thin place” experience at Iona that I will never forget. I was standing at the foot of St. Martin’s cross, just outside the Abby of Iona, not listening to the tour guide (because I was having trouble understanding her Irish brogue!) I looked up to the top of the massive stone cross, and I saw a full circular rainbow suspended around the top of the cross, exactly like a halo! In that brief and mystical moment, that place at the foot of the cross was for me a literal “thin place.”

Thin places can be actual places; however they can also be those times in life where one - for whatever reason - experiences God’s presence in a palpable but unexplainable way. I am grateful that many of you have shared your own “thin place” stories with me. Your thin places have been in hospital rooms and at deathbeds. They have happened while you were listening to music, or cupping communion elements in your hand, or looking at our Tree of Life Window, or reading a profound truth. They have occurred in nature, and in a counselor’s office, in marriage vows and in birthing rooms. When I hear your “thin place” stories, I am both humbled and in awe.

Celtic Christian thought and practice offers us ways to consider and perhaps experience what some of those thin places might be for us. That is

why I’m so excited that we are partnering with First Presbyterian Church to engage in a Lenten Study on Celtic Christianity. (The “C” is a hard “K” sound, not to be confused with a basketball team in Boston!) Starting on Sunday at 6 pm, we will gather at the Presbyterian Church - where there is free parking! - for a simple meal followed by a thoughtful session that will focus on one of the aspects of Celtic Christianity. Sessions will be based on a book by John Philip Newell titled *The Rebirthing of God: Christianity’s Struggle for New Beginnings*.

I sincerely hope you will decide to participate, whether it’s for one, a few, or all of the five sessions! Please call the office and let us know that you will be present.

The iconic choral conductor Joseph Flummerfelt died March 1 at age 82. As conductor and mentor at Westminster Choir College and conductor of the New York Choral Artists at the New York Philharmonic, he touched literally 1000's of lives. Short Update from Lesotho, Africa

Many have asked if we have heard from Mark Knowles and Danielle Murry-Knowles, who left in January to serve with Global Ministries in Lesotho, Africa. Mark reports that they are doing well, and getting settled. Danielle is working as Planning Officer for the Lesotho Evangelical Church in Southern Africa (LECSA). She serves as secretary for two organizations within the church (the Planning Commission and the Health Fund Steering Committee) that oversee health, education, and development projects. Mark is a Project Officer for LECSA, seeing the projects get implemented. His projects include things like putting latrines in schools, procuring textbooks for the Seminary, and other building projects for churches and schools. They recently attended a Global

Ministries conference in eSwatini (Swaziland) where this photo of Mark and Danielle was taken.

They also recently hosted their church’s neighborhood prayer group for the first time.


